How would you like to remember the children?

You can leave a legacy in one of four main ways:

- **A residuary legacy:** This is what remains of your estate when all other legacies and expenses have been paid, ie the residue. Such gifts are effectively inflation-proof and thus are really valuable to ICC.
- **A pecuniary legacy:** This means a specific sum of money. Such gifts are not linked to inflation so gradually decreases in value over time.
- **A percentage legacy:** Here you specify a certain percentage of your estate to go to ICC. This is a good way of being sure your gift maintains its value over time.
- **A specific legacy:** This is where you may choose to leave specific item(s) of value as gifts to ICC

Making a Will

Writing a will is a task we all seem to put off, but it is quite straightforward and inexpensive and ensures that your assets really do reach the people and organisations that you wish to benefit. Without one, you can leave behind confusion, heartache and lengthy legal battles.

Wills do not have to be lengthy and packed full with legal phrases

It would be a good idea to have the following information before visiting a solicitor as it would save you time and money:

- The approximate value of your home and any other property
- A list of furnishings and possessions of value
- The approximate value of all other financial assets
- The approximate value of your liabilities
- A list of people and charities to who you wish to leave money / possessions, with their full names, addresses and postcodes

If you have already made a will..... it's not too late! Your solicitor will be able to advise you on how you can include ICC in your will.

If you don't make a will... the law decides how your material possessions are distributed after your death
